VII. Today's Guest Speaker – (15 minutes)

Collin Coffey East Bay Regional Park District Board of Directors – Ward 7

This year is the 90th anniversary of the East Bay Park District. Collin represents Ward 7 which covers all of Northern and Eastern Contra Costa from Hercules to Brentwood and up in the Delta to Bethel Island

Priorities for 2024 include expanding public access, infrastructure maintenance of existing trails and facilities, further trail development natural and cultural resource conservation, fuels management and continuing land acquisition.

Brentwood and Oakley do not pay the standard property tax that the remainder of the County pay into the Park District. We do contribute to a Bond Measure that was issued in 2008 that is used for land acquisition,

We are unique in that Contra Costa and Alameda County in that we do not have our own park departments. The advantage is the East Bay Regional Park District is independent of any other jurisdiction and is operated by an independent board.

They are working on a ten-year plan for the district. They are going to ask for a lot of community input by having sessions – general population opportunities.

They have acquired title to the Concord Naval Weapons Station in the Concord Hills -2500 acres. The park has been named Thurgood Marshall Regional Park Home of the Port Chicago 50. Every Sunday in February from 9-1 they are going to have public walk and talks out in the future park. A naturalist will

give a talk about the area. Go the EBparks.org – and you can register for the event. This most likely would not be allowed today in the former confederate south.

The programming our naturalists do is very social justice oriented. We talk and educate about systemic racism that exists today.
