- B. Monica Wilson is running for AD 15 to replace Tim Grayson who is running for the Senate seat. Marisol Rubio is also running against Tim Grayson for Senator Glazier seat.
- C. Happy News: As reported on the Rachel Maddow show, the GOP parties in Minnesota, Colorado, Michigan and Arizona are all broke. I hope people keep sending their money to Trump and not to their State parties. Trump keeps appealing cases he has no chance of winning, so his PAC is also burning through money like crazy. With the state coffers low, we have more of a chance to elect democrats at the State and local levels.
- D. County: Builders are coming to the county for housing projects on county land requesting waivers on the density bonus so as to reduce the overall number of affordable units. Lumped in these waivers are reductions to green space and parking. The Board of Supervisors need to push back on builders to build as many affordable units instead of giving waivers to minimize affordable units and maximize builder profits.
