- i. When/Where: August 19-22, 2024 Democratic National Convention will be in Chicago.
- ii. How: Those wishing to attend may apply for 6 delegate spots for Contra Costa County. The California Democratic Party will be accepting and processing applications to become a delegate to the 2024 Democratic National Convention. <u>https://cadem.org/democratic-nationalconvention/</u>
- iii. Cost: No cost to attend except personal travel, hotel and food, which is borne by attendee. Delegates are obligated to attend the 2024 Democratic National Convention (August 19-22, 2024, in Chicago, Illinois). While there are no fees or dues required to become a delegate, there are costs associated with travel and accommodation for the national convention. Please note, these costs are not meant to preclude anyone from running as a delegate in fact, the Democratic Party strictly prohibits discrimination on the basis of status. However, the California Democratic Party does not furnish flights or hotels for the national convention, nor does it provide financial assistance to offset the costs of attending. The estimated costs of attending are: Airfare \$400-\$800; 5 Hotel nights \$1500; Food/incidentals \$500; Total: \$2400-\$2800.
