 - 1. Linda's final letter writing gathering in advance of the general election was held on October 26th. We are continuing to write GOTV letters to Georgia voters in advance of Raphael Warnock's runoff election against Herschel Walker.
 - 2. MCDC wrote 10,498 letters and postcards in addition to those sent by Doug's Swing Left team, with the goal of increasing participation of historically underrepresented communities and Democratic leaning voters in midterm elections, focusing on swing states.
