She has been involved with resource recovery for nearly 20 years. She began by working with large generators of electronic waste by organizing collection and drop off events. Then for over 10 years she focused solely on organic waste management and finished compost applications. She has supported commercial compost facilities throughout the West Coast and has worked closely with various end users of compost including the agriculture community. Erin has a B.A. from St. Mary's College in Liberal and Civic Studies and is a Certified Composting Professional through the US Composting Council. She is also a member of the California SB 54 Advisory Board, representing the compostable product manufacturers. In addition, she is on the Sustainability Commission for Contra Costa County.

XVII. For the Good of the Order (comments/suggestions)

- a. **Angela Lowry:** I am an elected official but speaking on my own as a local citizen. **AB205** signed in 2022. July 1st, PGE bill will be paying based on usage and a flat fee based on income. Democrats are looking for a repeal. Also looking for signature amendment of **Prop 47** that made it a misdemeanor if more than \$950 or less is stolen, to making it a felony for repeat offenders.
- b. **Jessica Morse:** campaign -3^{rd} congressional district Sacramento, Lake, Tahoe, Sierras will represent all the water than comes from this district. She is running against Kevin Kiley who is a MAGA Republican, supports the 2025 agenda, Moms to Liberty elected to school boards, and is pushing a national abortion ban. Kiley won because of low democratic turnouts for the primary. We know we can mobilize, and win based on turning out Democrats. Jessica Morse is the Deputy Secretary for Forest and Wildland Resilience at the California Natural Resources Agency. She is the only woman in a challenger's seat in California. She raised \$1M, but needs \$5M. Join us and help flip the house!

Land use Monday at 5:30 p.m.; Planning Commission Tuesday @ 6 pm. What is an example of what CEQA does? Looks at what developments do to neighborhood flow, calmness, etc.
