Monica Wilson updated us on Human Trafficking:

- There are two types: Sex and Labor
- It is a crime that happens right in the open

When not doing work on city council she works with a nonprofit, Love Never Fails – which is an anti-human trafficking organization that does outreach, search and recovery:

- They have seven safe houses in Alameda County
- They work throughout the Bay Area.
- She is currently their Senior Program Manager and she oversees their search and recovery area.
- The organization currently has a memorandum of understanding with CCC Family Services.
- In CCC they currently have 15 cases 14 young women and 1 man Most of our cases involve people who have been caught up in human trafficking or dangerously close to being lured into the trafficking world.
- Most of our cases are foster children in CCC.
- We meet individuals where they are at with them and their family to get that our of the life and make sure they have success.
- We do things like get them to school and some fun things.
- They make sure the County is seeing the cases through and that they have the resources that they need.
- She also oversees the Dream keepers Initiative a program that is out of San Francisco (20 cases of young men and women).
- She works closely with Diana Becton office with her human trafficking task force in CCC.
- Illegal Massage Parlors are bringing immigrants and trafficking them.

City Council:

- Police Reform started in 2020 started police reform mental health response team (MHRT), hiring.
- Texting scandal case is still ongoing. Most individuals are on administrative leave and some have been terminated.
- MHRT She ran on this not all calls need a police force response team is called in instead made up of professional mental health workers.
- She visited Portland to see how their MHRT works. It has been going on now for several years and has been successful.
- MHRT is up and running in Antioch.
- Other ongoing issues in California rent, housing and anti-harassment.

She is now running for State Assembly this year.
