Definition & History:

- ▶ Systemic Racism is the collective *failure* of an organization to provide for all citizens.
- ▶ Systemic Racism has existed in varying degrees from the inception of our nation until the present day.

Housing & Lending:

Examples:

- ▶ Financial Redlining
- ▶ Foreclosures 2004-2008
- ▶ Foreclosures 2007-2009
- ▶ 2017 Median Wealth

Voter Suppression:

Historical Methods:

- Poll Taxes
- Literacy Tests

Contemporary Methods:

- Purging voter rolls
- Limitations on early & absentee voting
- Voting procedures & disinformation
- Caging lists
- Identification requirements

Education:

▶ Today's K-12 Issues:

- ❑ Underfunding in minority areas
- ❑ Expectations
- ❑ Little positive reinforcements
- ❑ Inadequate staff support
- ❑ Lack of school enrichment &/or support
- ❑ Equitable funding at state &/or federal level
- ❑ Lack of transparency

▶ Post-Secondary Issues:

- ❑ Enrollment of minorities
- ❑ Access
- ❑ Cooperative arrangements
- ❑ Affirmative Action
 - Polls
 - Critics

Health:

- ▶ COVID-19
 - Minority communities more severely impacted
 - Greater risk of death
 - Lack of protective equipment
- ▶ Longevity of life
- ▶ Mental Health
- ▶ Lack of health insurance
- ▶ Shortage of primary care physicians
- ▶ Biases & stereotypes
- ▶ Environmental factors

Criminal Justice:

Areas of Impact:

- ▶ Policing & profiling
- ▶ The drug war
- ▶ Juries & jury selection
- ▶ The death penalty
- ▶ Prosecutors-discretion & plea bargaining
- ▶ Bail, pre-trial detention, commutations, pardons, gangs, etc.
- ▶ Impact of privately funded prisons
- ▶ School suspension & school-to-prison pipeline

Examples:

- ▶ Three times as many Black & Hispanic drivers are searched than White males.
- ▶ Blacks are arrested at a greater rate for marijuana use.
- ▶ Blacks are imprisoned at twice the rate of whites, with longer sentences
- ▶ 65% of prisoners serving life sentences for non-violent crimes are black.
- ▶ 1 out of 11 African Americans are disenfranchised due to felony convictions, compared to 1-56 non-black voters

Immigration:

Historical issues, examples:

- ▶ Many immigration policies were created from the inception of the nation to the present day.
- ▶ For example, in 1790 the Founders considered “free” people to be white and male.
- ▶ In 1924, a quota system was developed (The National Origins Act) and implemented.

Today’s issues, examples:

- ▶ DACA
- ▶ Ice (established 2003)
- ▶ Congress still has not developed a comprehensive immigration policy.

It’s time for our government to reflect & respond to the current realities of immigration in our world.

Environmental Justice:

Communities of color have:

- ❖ Higher rates of exposure to air pollution.
- ❖ More landfills, hazardous waste, sites, & other industrial facilities
- ❖ More lead poisoning affecting children of color.
- ❖ More climate change issues.
- ❖ Greater water contamination.
- ❖ More blighted neighborhoods (and housing)
- ❖ Lack of community resources, such as thriving businesses, garbage pick-up, lack of street repair, lack of health services, groceries, etc.

Possible Solutions:

- ▶ Close the racial wealth gap
- ▶ Eliminate inequities in public school quality
- ▶ Close employment & earning gaps
- ▶ End punitive policing
- ▶ Environmental Justice issues should be recognized & prioritized as a national issue.
